The Medical Benevolence Fund was revised by the National Leadership Team to provide help to pastors with medical costs who may have their compensation reduced during this pandemic.

The NLT has also authorized disbursements from our disaster relief fund for churches in dire need.

Brian Smith is helping our presbyteries and a number of our congregations conduct virtual meetings.

With Jerry Iamurri, my office is helping churches and presbyteries with guidance and provisional opinions addressing virtual worship and virtual meetings within our constitutional requirements.
