**Church Planting Team** Report to the 39<sup>th</sup> General Assembly

The 2018-2019 Church Planting Team (CPT) consists of TE Matt Brown, RE John Bueno, RE Jack Cathey, TE Bart Garrett, TE Jim Holland, and TE Rufus Smith, with TE Tom Ricks serving as the Team Leader. The CPT met August 8-10, 2018, and February 11-12, 2019, to plan and evaluate church planting ministry activities. While celebrating the fact that 7% of EPC churches were church plants, at its August 2018 meeting the CPT concluded that the EPC has hit a ceiling unless a different structure and more substantial staffing is funded. This was a key point of discussion when Ricks met with the National Leadership Team in January 2019. Tom also reported that many EPC churches are heavily invested in church planting outside of the EPC and outside the U.S. For example, Colonial Presbyterian Church in Kansas City, Missouri, and Parker EPC in Parker, Colorado, invest heavily in church planting in India and Ethiopia, respectively. The following are key events and activities in the past year.

#### **Church Planter's Retreat**

This year's retreat was held October 25-27, 2018, at Cheyenne Mountain Resort in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Nearly 50 EPC church planters, their spouses, and members of the CPT joined presbytery leaders and others for three days of training and renewal that included peer networking, breakout and mentoring sessions, fellowship, and prayer. Church planting "nuts-and-bolts" training sessions focused on topics such as fundraising, worship, self-care, and preaching in a start-up situation. A CPT goal for this retreat is that every presbytery helps fund the participation of its church planters and send its Church Development Committee chairman to this event. Tom Werner (Moderator of the EPC's 38<sup>th</sup> General Assembly) and his wife, Susan, attended the 2018 retreat.

#### **Church Planter Cohorts**

It is a goal for every EPC church planter to participate in a cohort. This is a small, "virtual"

group of peers led by an experienced church planter. The initial cohort was launched in the last year, with four church planters meeting with Bart Garrett, Lead Pastor of Christ Church East Bay in Oakland, California. The cohort meets monthly via FaceTime and covers topics essential to the first two years of church planting, following a curriculum that Garrett has developed. These meetings also provide a place for cohort members to check in, as well as support and pray for each other. Another cohort is being prepared for launch, as six church planters have signed up for the next cohort.

#### **Church Planting "Road Map"**

The CPT is very grateful for the work of Phil VanValkenburg, COO of the Office of the General Assembly. He produced a Church Planting "Road Map" that provides a checklist of important organizational, financial, and legal requirements a church plant needs to implement to ensure problems in these areas don't emerge.

#### **Other Work of the Team**

- 1. Leadership Diagnostic for church planters and potential launch teams
- 2. Encouraging the formation of and supporting existing EPC church planting networks, of which there are now seven: Resurrection Brooklyn (New York), Detroit, St. Louis, Memphis, Aspen Grove (Denver), Bay Area (California), and Presbytery of the Gulf South.
