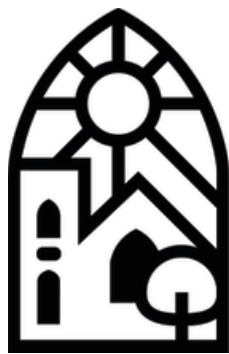

Stewarding creation

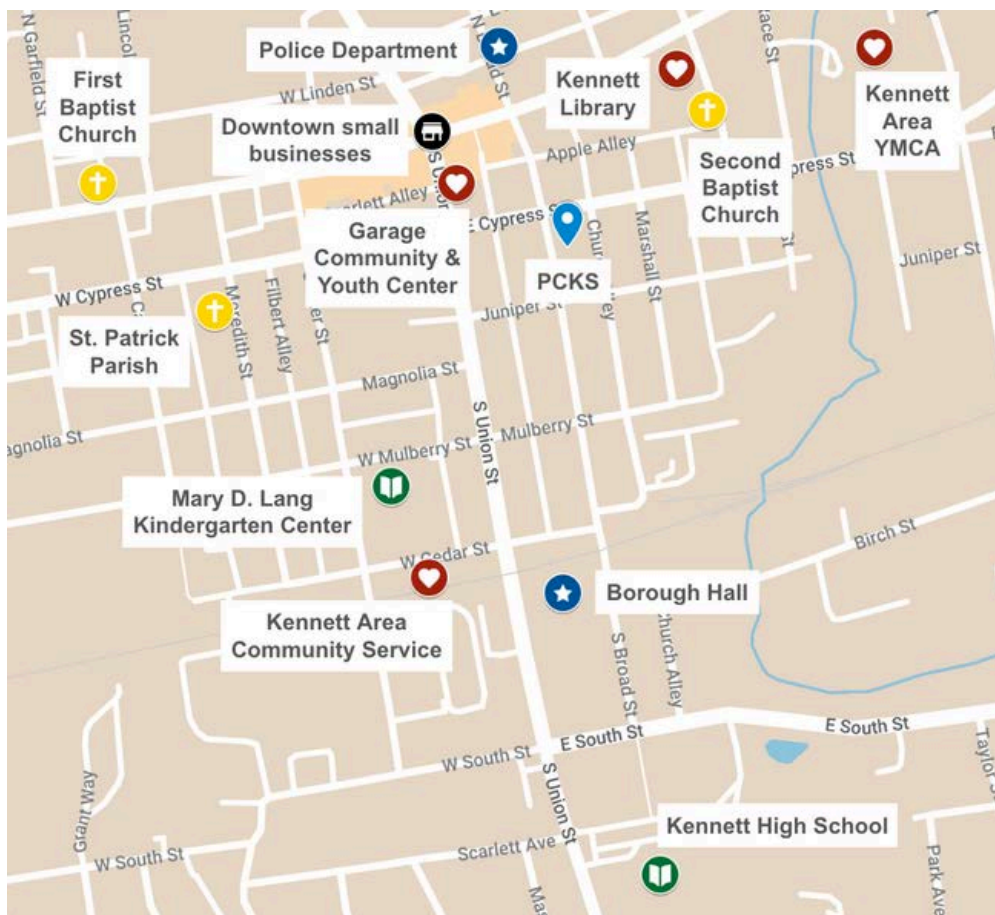

Our place

Over 150 years ago, PCKS was founded when Reverend David Moore began holding services in Kennett Square. Since then, we've preserved and improved the historic buildings in our care and sought to serve our community.



At times, the leadership has considered whether PCKS should relocate to have more space (particularly for parking!), but we have the strong sense that God has called us to our neighbors right in the center of the borough. We are committed to stay here! And so, decades after God planted this congregation on South Broad Street, we continue by his grace to serve him and Kennett Square.





Our community

Kennett Square is a vibrant town with shops, restaurants, and beautiful historic architecture. We love our traditions, like the Mushroom Festival, dining in the streets on Third Thursdays in the summer, and the Mushroom Drop on New Year's Eve.

We're located 45 minutes outside Philadelphia in the southern part of Chester County, the wealthiest county in Pennsylvania. The migrant community makes up a significant portion of the population due in part to the local mushroom agriculture industry. This mix of history, socioeconomic opportunity, and culture creates a unique community – almost a small city in our small town.
